Duration: The total study time for the complete programme shall be not less than two academic years and not more than five academic years.

Delivery is online.

Assessment: By a combination of written examination and course work, as prescribed for each course. In addition, MSc candidates must submit a dissertation on their individual project, and may be required to undergo an oral examination. The degree of MSc shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS Grade of D3 or above in the individual project, irrespective of their performance in other courses.

The Certificate and the Diploma shall be awarded to those candidates who achieve the prescribed standard in the relevant courses for these awards but who fail to satisfy the requirements of progression to, or who elect not to proceed to, the Diploma or MSc programme, respectively.
