EL50D4 Interdisciplinary Approaches to the Renaissance (30 credit points)

Stage 2

Students must take the following:

EL55D5 Investigating Texts: Research Skills for Postgraduate English Studies (30 credit points)

Plus 30 credits from the following:

EL55C2 Writing the Self (30 credit points)
EL55D2 Fundamentals of English Language (30 credit points)

Stage 3

EL5919 English Literature and Language Dissertation (MLitt) (60 credit points)

PART TIME ROUTE

Students will take a total of 180 course credits over two years.

Year 1

Students must take the following:

PD5006 Getting Started at the University of Aberdeen (0 credit points) must be taken in Year 1
PD50C2 Critical Skills: Reading and Engagement (0 credit points) must be taken in Year 1
PD55C1 Critical Skills: Research and Dissemination (0 credit points) must be taken in Year 1
EL50C3 A Social and Textual History of the English Language (30 credit points)
EL55D5 Investigating Texts: Research Skills for Postgraduate English Studies (30 credit points)

Year 2

Students are required to select 60 credits from available EL coded Level 5 courses plus the dissertation.

EL5919 English Literature and Language Dissertation (MLitt) (60 credit points)

Assessment: By combination of coursework, written and oral examinations where appropriate for each course. The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS Grade of 9 (D3) or above in EL5919, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
