Duration: 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (MLitt); 12 months full-time or 24 months part-time (PgDip).

Stage 1

- LN5009 Key Concepts and Methods in Translation Studies (30 credit points)
- LN5019 Communication Theory and Analysis (30 credit points)

Stage 2

Students must take the following:

Stage 3

Students must take the following:

PART TIME ROUTE

Assessment: By combination of coursework, written and oral examinations where appropriate for each course. The degree of MLitt shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a CGS Grade of 9 (D3) or above in LN5901, irrespective of their performance in other courses.
