Content: Candidates undertake the following:

This programme has entry points for both September and January. Candidates should undertake the appropriate course for their entry point and mode of study.

Candidates must complete LN5049/LN5549 and LN5050/LN5550 before they can enrol on courses at Stage 2.

Candidates must complete Stage 1 and 2 before they can enrol in Stage 3.

Stage 3

LN5555 or LN5955 Dissertation in Translation Studies (MSc) (60 credit points)

For Both Routes (full-time and part-time):

The degree of MSc shall not be awarded to a candidate who fails to achieve a grade of D3 or above in the Dissertation in Translation Studies (LN5555/LN5955) and the Language-Specific Translation Portfolio (LN5048/LN5548), irrespective of their performance in other courses.
