

Duration: 12 months or 24 months or 36 months part-time.

Content:

12 MONTHS PART TIME ROUTE (PgCert)

This route will run over one year. Students will take a maximum of 60 credit points over the year. 30 credit points must be taken in the first semester and 30 credit points in the second semester.

24 MONTHS PART TIME ROUTE (PgDip)

This route will run over two years. Students will take a maximum of 120 credit points over the two years. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 1. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 2.

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36 MONTHS PART TIME ROUTE (MLitt)

This route will run over three years. Students will take a maximum of 180 credit points over the three years. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 1. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 2. 60 credit points must be taken in Year 3.
